We will also see the mural dedicated to silk weaving, a Big Rock, a tiny vineyard maintained by the République des Canuts (silk weavers), a one-of-a-kind garden: a gem of naïve art, some creative entrepreneurs, etc, and of course the secret passageways known as traboules, and finally a good meal in a restaurant located on the slopes of the hill.

In the afternoon, let us all go to the left bank of Lyon, and enjoy either free time for shopping or a tasting with commentary at the Paul Bocuse Gastronomic Market Hall. The evening is spent at a Café-Théâtre.

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Day 2

In the morning, a tasty discovery of the 16th-century Old Lyon district followed by a visit to the iconic Basilica of Fourvière.

Lunch in a traditional *bouchon Lyonnais* restaurant.
